<u>Learning, Communicating, and Excelling in a Neurodiverse World –</u>

Jenny Liu, Julissa Cadenillas, Jared Kornblatt, and Peter Flom

<u>Description</u>: Have you or your family ever felt misunderstood, different, or unable to fit in? In today's <u>neurodiverse world</u>, one observation holds true: individuals think, learn, and communicate differently. These behaviors can create challenges when navigating institutional and social norms. Many of those norms neither account for nor accommodate neuroatypical learning and communication styles, ranging from differences in attention regulation to literalism with an aversion to "small talk."

When others require pleasantries for connection, neurodivergent individuals may struggle to reconcile differences with neurotypical peers. This dynamic – cloaked in normative language and unspoken etiquette across educational, social, and professional settings – can become problematic for children and adults. Neurodivergent traits may be misinterpreted as stubbornness, perfectionism, or rudeness, rather than understood as differences in cognition and communication.

This panel discussion seeks to engage, educate, and elevate the audience's understanding of neurodiversity by sharing three distinct and yet complementary perspectives. Together, they aim to surface these challenges, examine their real-world consequences, and help the audience understand how to better work with each other.
