Code of Conduct

We aim at having a great event together. Respecting this Code of Conduct will help. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Our contract with the hotel requires us to enforce certain regulations and codes of conduct while at BLAST!, so we ask that you observe these few rules:

1. Please wear your badge at all times with no exceptions. Please note that kids' badges will be a different color than adult badges. Anyone who is not wearing a BLAST! name-tag won't be allowed in our hospitality or program rooms. This is a security issue. Please be kind and cooperate.
2. Do not engage in the use of any illegal substances (or violate any other laws) on the premises. The beer and wine are only for registrants who are at least 21 years old.
3. If you have brought children with you to BLAST! we remind you that their welfare, safety, and behavior are your responsibility. Please don't leave your young people unaccompanied and do control them so they are not a disturbance to the other BLAST! guests. Also, a few events may be noted as "adults only" and we must enforce that rule.
4. The games in our game room belong to someone. Please don't take any out of the room, even for a little while, and be as cautious as if it was yours.
5. No smoking or vaping is permitted anywhere in the hotel. This includes any form of tobacco and tobacco-less e-cigarettes.
6. Any direction regarding food safety must be followed.
7. Each member is a representative of Mensa. Your conduct reflects on our group. Anyone causing a problem at BLAST! with the hotel or another member will be asked to leave the gathering without refund and not welcomed back. The hospitality committee is working hard to keep the hospitality suite stocked with food and beverages. Please clean up after yourself by tossing your paper plates, cups, etc. in the trash.
8. Harassment: BLAST! is a friendly and safe environment for our attendees. Unwelcome physical contact and other forms of harassment will not be tolerated. Failure to comply with this policy may result in removal from the event without a refund, and police intervention if warranted. 

Build Mensa by Building Your Chapter

Northern New Jersey Mensa has won a Diamond Award for the past four years. We appreciate the recognition, but we want all Mensa chapters to perform at the highest level. So we freely share our playbook!

American Mensa's Local Group Jewel Awards recognize good performance by local groups. Local groups earn points by doing tasks (e.g., submitting financial reports) on time and by doing things that benefit the membership (e.g., publishing a newsletter and holding a regional gathering). The achievement levels, from lowest to highest, are Emerald, Sapphire, Ruby, and Diamond. The Diamond Award is given to the top-performing local group in its size class. For the past four years, Northern New Jersey Mensa won the Diamond for Class II.

Our success was no accident. In 2020, Northern New Jersey Mensa was

practically dormant. Then, Franck Mounier became Local Secretary (LocSec), upon the death of his predecessor. His first act as LocSec was to recruit Kimberly Strickland to form an executive committee. They based their strategic plan on the Jewel Award point system. Their goal was to win the Diamond, which the chapter did in 2021-2022. Under their guidance, the chapter won two more Diamonds. After Franck and Kimberly joined the AMC, we won our fourth Diamond.

Along with holding picnics and BLAST! regional gatherings, we started our IGNITE! RG just for Young Mensans. Richard Schaefer has consistently held monthly testing sessions and been honored with Testing Coordinator of the year in 2025.

To help other chapters in American Mensa thrive, articles about our strategic plan and our Jewel Award success

ran in the Mensa Bulletin.

Northern New Jersey Mensa has made its mark within American Mensa. Now, we are planning to make a difference in our communities. At 9 AM on Saturday, Young Mensan Tanvi Gopal will talk about her quantum computing advocacy. At 10:30 AM on Saturday, Young Mensan Rohan Raghu will talk about his [Numeraldo](#) foundation, to help people learn math. At 7:30 PM on Saturday Laurie Endicott Thomas will talk about how Northern New Jersey Mensa can help struggling school districts succeed in teaching reading. 
